Jesus said to him, Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. - Matt 22:37

As we continue our journey through these forty days of Easter, it would be wise for us to keep the end in mind. We are coming up to the end of the Easter season to what I like to refer to as "The Heart of The Order" of the Church year. Now I'm not talking about Babe Ruth, Lou Gehrig, and Earle Combs – the players who made up the heart of the batting order for the '27 Yankees – because this is a much, much bigger deal to each of Jesus' followers!

Individually, each of these upcoming Sundays on the Church calendar could be considered the most important day for us to celebrate and learn more about. Our three-week series starts with Ascension Sunday. The significance of that day is too broad of a topic to lay out in detail here. It's the day the Old Testament prophets talked about and the day Jesus said would indicate that His earthly work was accomplished and would also signify the end of His earthly ministry.

Jesus ascension into heaven also paved the way for the Holy Spirit to enter into the world and into the hearts of His followers and those who put their trust in Him. The church calls this day "Pentecost Sunday" and we celebrate the fact that the very life, breath, and energy of Jesus lives inside our hearts to shape our lives. The celebration of Pentecost Sunday reminds us that we have a unifying spirit poured out for us by our glorious Father in Heaven so that we are co-heirs with Christ.

The third Sunday of the heart of the order ties the Old Testament and the New Testament together for the Church of the first century, the twenty-first and beyond. Through our celebration of Trinity Sunday, we gain a better understanding of how God exists and how He works in our lives. Again, the Psalms and the Old Testament Prophets tell us to live into this reality and to embrace it as the building blocks of our relationship with our Creator, Savior, and Comforter.

Join us in these upcoming Sundays to learn how to apply these truths to your life.

**Secretary's Report:** Correction made to the March 18th minutes - Ellen Pritzlaff was absent and needs to be added into the report. A motion was made by Andy Mercier and seconded by Ellen Pritzlaff to approve the March 2024 minutes with the correction described above. Motion approved.

**Treasurer's Report:** Andy Shamburek provided a paper report detailing a net ordinary income of \$3,180.28. Our total giving as of 4/15/24 is approximately \$85,487.18 and the operating fund is \$37,675.73. Andy Shamburek reported that our offering totals for 2024, this far, are up about

\$10,000 and our net ordinary income is about \$3,000 more this year than at this time in 2023. A motion was made by Kent Lyng and seconded by Allie McDonald to approve the treasurer's report. Motion approved.

#### **Old Business:**

- Capital Projects the council is exploring the costs involved in replacing/updating the sanctuary sound system; more information needs be to obtained before an estimated cost can be provided (i.e. how much work can be done in house and what equipment does not need to be replaced)
- Easter Sunday: Jelly Bean Jam had approximately 40 kids present, over 400 eggs were filled and hidden for the egg hunt, a parachute game was played with the kids, small gift bags with candy, a stuffed animal and religious trinkets were handed out to each kid and 3 baskets were raffled off to the JAM participants. A brass quintet pformed at both services; the music was "beautiful" and the congregation truly enjoyed the musical treat. A thankyou card will be sent to Kelly for organizing the brass quintet. The Fellowship Brunch had several delicious snacks and refreshments to be shared between services.

#### Committee Reports (if any)

1. **Evangelism** - Jeff Schullo reported 75 meals were served at the April "To God's Glory" luncheon. The employees at The Cottage had provided the soup and sandwiches that were served; the congregation provided the desserts. Jeff will have tables set up with information about the Compassion project on April 28th. Joyful Noise prep has begun; it will be on 6/29 at the East Side Beach.

- 2. **Parish Education** Heidi Anderson reported there are enough lesson teachers and crew leaders signed up for the remainder of the JAM year (ending on 5/12). This year's VBS theme will be announced in May along with sign-ups and advertisements. VBS will be July 21st 25th.
- 3. Parish Fellowship Andy Mercier reported no update at this time.
- 4. **Property & Maintenance** Kent Lyng reported an estimate of \$25,000 to remove all the flooring in the basement hall (this includes the asbestos removal) with an additional \$25,000 to install carpeting (carpet squares). Minor maintenance things were taken care of around the church.
- 5. Public Relations no update at this time, position is still open and needs to be filled.
- 6. **Stewardship** Ellen Pritzlaff reported on April 6th Grace Lutheran hosted "To the Ends of the Earth" OCC Celebration; the 12 counties of the Green Bay area were invited to come and share in fellowship, refreshments and door prizes. The area representative, Sheri, had high regards for the welcoming attitude of the members of Grace and the loving environment we provide; she stated our enthusiasm for OCC is "contagious". Ellen plans to have Grace Lutheran put together a total of 600 boxes for OCC this year. Ellen worked with Heidi to present and teach the kids in JAM about OCC on April 7th. The kids put together over 300 hundred tic-tac-toe games that will go in the OCC boxes and had a lot of fun doing it; it may become an annual event for the JAM kids. Ellen also reported the Women's group will be hosting a prayer vigil on May 2nd from 7am to 7pm; Pam Langlay will be running the event and will have materials and suggestions for prayers. - 11. **Pastor's Report** Pastor Gary reported he will be out of town on 4/28. He also reviewed the OCC celebration Grace Lutheran hosted on 4/6 and praised everyone who continues to enthusiastically create a welcoming environment here at Grace.




